## ECONLIT

**WHAT IS ECONLIT?:** EconLit indexes economic literature from over 400 mostly English-language journals as well as books, dissertations, conference proceedings, Cambridge University Press Abstracts of Working Papers in English, and the full text of **Journal of Economic Literature** book reviews. Indexing of many journals begins with 1969. Approximately 25% of the records from 1987-1989 have abstracts, and 50% of those added since 1989 have abstracts. EconLit contains over 735,000 records with more than 27,000 added annually.



**ACCESSING ECONLIT:** EconLit is available from any computer with Internet access within CUNY. To access it, go to the Mina Rees Library Web site ([library.gc.cuny.edu](http://library.gc.cuny.edu)) and click **Databases**. **FULL TEXT:** EconLit includes links to the full text of articles from other databases, such as Academic Search Premier.  will help locate the text elsewhere.

**BASIC SEARCH:** Basic or keyword searches look for your term(s) within the abstracts. Citations appear in reverse chronological order. You may limit your search to specific journals or publication dates.

**ADVANCED SEARCH:** Advanced searches allow you to perform more sophisticated Boolean searches by limiting search terms to particular fields such as **Abstract, Author, Author Affiliation, Subjects, Named Person, Source** (journal or book title), etc. Additional options for limiting or expanding results are also available.

**DISPLAYING RESULTS:** Searches result only in bibliographic citations unless you click the titles of articles or click **Preferences** at the top of the screen and select the **Detailed** format which will provide brief abstracts. These options also allow you to sort the results by author or source in addition to date.

**PRINTING:** To print, e-mail, or save citations or the full text of articles, click the  icon next to the record to add the item to your folder. When you have finished selecting items, click the  icon and choose from the options displayed. Printing is not available from library PCs. To print within the library, you must log into your Graduate Center account at the Information Technology PCs by the windows on the second floor, on the Concourse level, and at the computer commons on most floors.

**ADDITIONAL RESOURCES:** Full-text economics titles are available from Academic Search Premier, Business Source Premier, JSTOR, LexisNexis, Project Muse, ScienceDirect, SpringerLink, and Wiley InterScience.
