
New York Times Full Text

The **New York Times Full Text** contains page images of the complete *New York Times* from 1851 through 2003. It serves as a searchable electronic alternative to the print or microfilm archive. Individual newspapers may be browsed by date or articles may be located through searches. The database is available from any location within the Graduate Center by going to the library Web site (*library.gc.cuny.edu*) and clicking **Databases**. Off-campus access is explained at *library.gc.cuny.edu/info_gc/remote.asp*.

Searching The New York Times Full Text

1. To search for an article by subject, author, or type:

- **Basic Search** option allows you to search using any keywords or phrases along with dates or date ranges.
- **Advanced Search** option allows you to search within citations and article text, citation and abstract, text only, abstract only, author, or title.
- Clicking on **More Search Options** allows additional restrictions. Options include articles, editorials, photos, ads, cartoons, obituaries, and front-page stories.
- When the results of a search are displayed, you have three retrieval options:
 -  **article image**: full article displayed with Adobe Acrobat Reader;
 -  **page map**: display of the entire page on which the article appears;
 -  **bibliographic citation and abstract**.

2. To browse a specific issue of The New York Times

- Select the **Basic Search** screen. Leave the main search box empty. Enter a date in the **On this date** option box and click on **Search**.
- You are presented with a list of article titles for that date.
- Select any article, and click on the page map option ().
- A box indicates the current page number of the newspaper as well as the full range of pages for that issue. Enter a page number or use the **Previous** or **Next** commands.
- Clicking on **Page Image** will create an Adobe Acrobat PDF image of the entire page.
- Click on a section of the page to create an Adobe Acrobat image of the article.



PRINTING AND E-MAILING

Articles may be printed, e-mailed, or saved as abstracts or page images. For a single article, open the article in any format, and click on either the print or e-mail link. If you are e-mailing the article image, make sure to select the **Page/Article** image option. To send multiple articles, mark the boxes to the left of the article, and click **View marked articles**. You will have the option to e-mail images of all marked articles or print all citations.

To save an article, open the image or page map, and click on the save option within Acrobat. Be aware that PDF images are extremely large and are best downloaded onto a zip drive.
