PsycArticles

WHAT IS PSYCARTICLES?: It covers general psychology and basic, applied, specialized, clinical, and theoretical research in psychology. It offers over 40,000 full-text articles from 45 American Psychological Association journals and eight journals of allied organizations from 1985 to the present. PsycArticles also includes letters to the editor and errata. This resource was purchased with Student Technology Fee funds.

ACCESSING PSYCARTICLES: The database is available throughout the Graduate Center by going to the Mina Rees Library's Web site at library.gc.cuny.edu and clicking *Databases*. Home access is explained at library.gc.cuny.edu/info/remote_gc.asp.


BASIC SEARCH: Use the Basic Search screen when performing both simple searches and keyword searches such as *depression and adolescen* and wom?n*. Such searches look for your term(s) in the article title, author name, and abstract portions of a record. Options for searching within the full text and for related words appear at the bottom of the search screen. You may also limit a search to a specific publication or date and may choose to exclude book reviews.

ADVANCED SEARCH: Use the Advanced Search to search for terms and/or names in such specific fields as author, article title, journal name, etc. The same limiters are available as in the Basic Search.

DISPLAYING FULL TEXT: Most PsycArticles records offer the option of seeing the text as either an HTML document or a PDF file (Full Page Image). Displaying PDF files requires having a recent version of Adobe Acrobat Reader on your computer.

PUBLICATIONS SEARCH: Use the Publications Search for an alphabetical list of the available journals. To see all the contents of all available issues of a journal, click the box in front of its name and the Search button. More than one journal may be selected. Contents are listed in reverse chronological order.

AUTHOR SEARCH: Use the Author Search for an alphabetical list of the authors of all available articles. You may also use the Browse box to search for authors. Click the box in front of a name(s) and the Search button to find articles by the author(s).

FOLDER: To add items to a folder, click the  [Add](#) icon beside the bibliographic record. When you have finished searching and adding items to the folder, click View Folder to print, e-mail, or save the items to a disk. When e-mailing an article to yourself or others, you might wish to choose the HTML format because some e-mail systems may not process PDF attachments.

SAVING SEARCHES: Whenever you see , a stable URL has been created for your search. Use this URL to rerun your search.

LINKS TO PSYCARTICLES: Search results in Academic Search Premier and PsycInfo will include links to full text from PsycArticles.

OTHER RESOURCES: In addition to the 53 journals in PsycArticles, the full text of articles from additional psychological journals is available from Academic Search Premier, JSTOR, Project Muse, ScienceDirect, SpringerLink, and Wiley InterScience. Links to 400 full-text journals in psychology may be found at library.gc.cuny.edu/research/psycholgy.asp#journals.
