## **SPRINGERLINK** (formerly Kluwer Online) Full Text of 259 Journals

**WHAT IS SPRINGERLINK?:** It offers the full text of recent issues of 259 journals published by Springer and Kluwer. While most of these titles are in the social sciences and sciences, there are some in the humanities, particularly in linguistics and philosophy.

**ACCESSING SPRINGERLINK:** SpringerLink is available anywhere within the Graduate Center by going to the Mina Rees Library's Web site ([library.gc.cuny.edu](http://library.gc.cuny.edu)) and clicking *Databases* or by going directly to [www.springerlink.com](http://www.springerlink.com). The database is also available at Baruch, Bronx Community College, Brooklyn, City College, Hunter, John Jay, Lehman, Queens, and Staten Island. The available titles represent the journals published by Springer or Kluwer to which the participating libraries have print subscriptions. **BASIC SEARCH:** SpringerLink's basic search allows you to search only for journal or article titles. Use the advanced search for most searches.

**ADVANCED SEARCH:** The articles-by-text advanced search allows searching by keyword, publication, author, abstract, and full text. When keyword searches provide too many results, search only in the abstract. When there are too few results, expand the search to the full text. Use articles-by-citation advanced search when looking for articles by a specific author or in a specific publication.

**SUBSCRIBED JOURNALS:** While SpringerLink searches the content of over 2,000 journals, CUNY has access only to the content of 259 journals. Look for the  subscribed icon to determine what text is

available. You can also determine which full-text titles are available by going to *Browse* and selecting *Viewable Publications Only*.

**OTHER RESOURCES:** SpringerLink is only one of several full-text journal databases in the social sciences and sciences. Also use Academic Search Premier, JSTOR, Project Muse, PsycArticles, Sage Psychology Collection, ScienceDirect, and Wiley InterScience. Bibliographic citations with links to text can be found in EconLit, General Science Abstracts, PsycInfo, Social Science Abstracts, and Sociological Abstracts.

**HELP:** Librarians at the reference desk on the second floor are eager to assist you in using SpringerLink effectively.
